SURFSIDE BEACH TOWN COUNCIL

JANUARY 5, 1971

The regular scheduled meeting of the Surfside Beach Town Council was held at 8:00 P.M., January 5, 1971. Meeting was opened with invocation by Councilman Freeland.

Minutes of the previous council meeting were read and approved. Minutes of the special meeting of December 8, were read and approved.

WATER WORKS IMPROVEMENT

Mayor Smith stated that we had received a letter from Southern Gulf Utilities saying that only 40% of Southern Gulf Utilities water distribution system was in Horry County which is located in the corporate limits of Surfside Beach. The Town Attorney is to investigate. He also said that we could file a petition with the Public Service Commission to see if the town could only buy a portion of the water works system from Southern Gulf Utilities. Further study will be made.

CLERK-TREASURERS REPORT

Mr. Graham gave his financial report. Stated that 83% of the taxes have been paid and the annual water bills had gone out on December 31, and are to be paid by March 30. The Clerk presented a letter from Mr. Robert B. Fleming concerning his taxes. Mr. Fleming was serving with the Air Force and requested a refund on his previous taxes. Mayor Smith asked the Clerk to write Mr. Fleming to have him present the town with copies of his paid receipts from his previous taxes. Financial picture was favorable.

WATER WORKS REPORT

Mr. Stroupe made 4 water taps at \$440 and permits \$248.50. Also 42 yearly accounts were put on monthly basis and had 4,000 ft. of tested pipe. Mayor Smith commented on Mr. Stroupe's work since he has been with the Town. Mr. Graham read the letter in which will be going out concerning the change over in the yearly water accounts to monthly accounts.

STREETS

Mr. Felix stated that he would complete putting the stop signs up on the south and north end within four days. He also stated that he would need 25 more stop signs at \$150 and 23 street replacements signs at approximately \$211. He said that 17 street signs had been taken. He also requested that the swash be cleaned out. Mr. Graham is to call Mr. Hart with the S. C. Highway Dept. to see if we can get the county to help clean the swash.

Mr. Coleman stated that they spent \$60 in picking up the paper along the streets.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Councilman Sorensen stated that they had spent \$2400 for fire equipment and would like to fix a generator for lights and current in case of emergency storms.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief Shirk gave the following monthly police report:

MINUTES

SURFSIDE BEACH TOWN COUNCIL

FEBRUARY 2, 1971

The regular scheduled meeting of the Surfside Beach Town Council was held at 8:00 P. M., February 2, 1971. The meeting was opened with invocation by Councilman Freeland.

Comments on minutes of previous meeting. Councilman Sorensen stated that it was approved by council for the funds for the rescue squad to repair a generator to be placed in the Police Department for lights and current in case of emergency. Correction was made by Clerk to include this in the minutes. The minutes of the special meeting of January 11, 1971, were approved.

NEW WATER WORKS IMPROVEMENTS

Mayor Smith stated that they had a conference with the supervisor over the new water works improvements concerning getting on other peoples property and that they were following through with the job. He advised the council that the town was saving \$8,000 on engineering fee and suggested this be spent for water meters. The Federal Grant in the amount of \$2,973.00 was approved to complete the courtroom.

WATER WORKS

Mr. Stroupe installed two water taps and sold two building permits. He advised the council that we had written Mr. Dowd concerning his house on 17th. Ave. North that had burned and had heard no reply. The Town Attorney requested that we write another letter to Mr. Dowd to have him board and clean up his house. The Town Attorney also advised us not to extend any water lines unless requested and paid for by the developer.

DOGS

Mrs. Platt stated that the dogs were being picked up but the pen needed to be repaired before anymore could be picked up. Mr. Coleman said that he would have his men repair the pen on Wednesday. It was also stated to charge \$5.00 per dog and \$1.50 per day for board.

CLERK'S REPORT

Mrs. Epperly gave the financial report for the General Government and the Gross Revenue accounts and stated that the monthly water bills had gone out Friday, January 29. The financial report was favorable. Mayor Smith commented Mrs. Epperly and Mrs. Martinez on their work.

STREETS

Mr. Felix reported that he had put the stop signs up and was working on the street signs and clearing the corner of the streets.

Mr. Coleman stated that he had a weeks vacation and four days of holidays coming to him. Council stated that he could take his vacation when he wanted to. Mr. Felix stated that he would help with his department while on vacation.

POLICE

Chief Shirk presented his monthly written report as follows: 28 arrests, 26 complaints, 6 dog complaints and \$935.00 in fines. Mayor Smith brought up about the police department having a part-time man helping out to answer the telephone and suggested that we purchase a message repeater or install a telephone in the policemen's house to be answered by them from five o'clock to midnight. Chief Shirk is to check into this and provide the council with the information.

PLANNING BOARD

Mrs. Platt read the minutes from the Planning Board meeting in which several requests were made for the council to consider as follows: To re-zone Surfside Drive from a residential to commercial. Mayor Smith stated that the property owners would have to petition council for this request. To take action on the drainage ditch which runs parallel to Surfside Drive & 1st. Ave. North.

Mr. Martin suggested that we pay Mr. Graham \$30 for 3 days a week for two hours a day to assist Mrs. Epperly in her department. Council stated that if Mrs. Epperly should need Mr. Graham then she could call him. Also suggested a full-time fireman to answer the fire calls in which the fire insurance rates would be reduced for the citizens of Surfside. With no further business the meeting adjourned.

MINUTES

FEBRUARY 18, 1971

The following information was given on the two programs which they offer:

Permanent

1. There is a public need for flood insurance.
2. The extent, if any, of existing flood management activities such as zoning, building codes, flood control works, land use regulations, whether public or private
3. Willingness to take official actions to carry out the objectives of the program with regard to the studies to be made.
4. Approve the long-range land management & use of flood-prone areas

Temporary

1. An intent to do what is necessary to qualify.

Communities must

- (a) Restrict development of land exposed to flood damage
- (b) Guide the development of proposed construction away from flood prone areas
- (c) Assist in reducing damage caused by floods

The above information is to be discussed with the county to determine whether an application will be filed as a group with the county or as an individual by the Town of Surfside Beach. Mr. Smith will notify the council regarding this information.

POLICE DEPT.

Chief Shirk gave his monthly police report consisting of 8 arrests, 11 complaints, 1 accident and \$145.00 in fines. The grant has been approved to employ a full-time policeman starting April 1 and the radio equipment grant has been approved also. The Chief indicated that they had several applications to review for this position.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made and approved by council to prorate retail license the last six months of the license year.

Mayor Smith indicated that the Conway National Bank would like to set up a place of business in Surfside Beach. The council will have a special meeting pertaining to this at a later date.

March 31, 1971

OLD BUSINESS

SURFSIDE BEACH TOWN COUNCIL

APRIL 6, 1971

The regular scheduled meeting of the Surfside Beach Town Council was held at 8:00 P. M. on April 6, 1971. The meeting was opened with invocation by Councilman Freeland.

Minutes of the previous council meeting were read and approved. Also the special council meeting minutes for March 17 and March 31, were also approved.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Lloyd Conner and Tommy Bullwinkle appeared before the council for request of rezoning of lots 4 and 5 on Palmetto drive from R-2 to R-3. Council stated that Mr. Conner should talk to Mr. Calhoun and the other property owners first.

Mr. Conner also presented the council with a petition for the towns assistance in obtaining immediate relief of the following unsanitary, unhealthful, and unsafe conditions which exist in this area.

(A) Improper area Drainage: All surface and run-off water from the streets and blocks of property located between and adjacent to both 16th Ave. N. and 17th. Ave. N. East of Cedar Drive drains downgrade and toward the east. This surface and run-off water converges on both Lake Fisher which abuttes to 16th Ave. N. plus a small area of approximately 7 homes located between 16th Ave. N. and 17th Ave. N.

(B) Lack of Maintenance and upkeep of street and roadway drainage. The lack of maintenance and upkeep to existing street and culvert drainage have compounded the pollution and drainage problem in our areas.

(C) No adequate outfall drainage of Lake Fisher. At the present time the lack of an adequate overflow and out fall drainage system is causing serious stagnation and pollution.

Mr. Robert Nyborg mailed a petition to the town in which he requested to be allowed to put a 6 foot fence up in his yard to keep his pets in and for privacy for outdoor activities. The council decided that it would be permissible for Mr. Nyborg to build a 6 ft. fence as long as it wasn't a curtain wall type. Mayor Smith ask the Town Clerk to write Mr. Nyborg and give him this information.

MINUTES

APRIL 6, 1971

Mr. Jimmy Squires gave the report on the Planning and Promotion Board. They would still like a sign on highway 544 on the Conway By-Pass. He also gave an outline as to the activities that have been planned for the Sun Fun Festivale in Surfside Beach. They are having a watermelon contest, surfing contest, beauty contest and many other activities. He asked permission to have the vehicles pull the boats on the beach to the ocean, and to have the sirens blow at 9:00 A. M. to start off the Sun Fun Activities. He asked that the town contribute \$100 for the ribbons and other awards. Mayor Smith stated that this would come from the Recreation Dept.

WATER WORKS

Mr. Stroupe gave his report in which he sold \$910 in building permits and \$1,385 in water taps for the month of March. He also stated that the tank foundation was on the ground.

STREETS

Mr. Felix stated that had the map marked as to where the new street lights would be installed and that a letter would go with this to the S. C. Public Service Authority. He has 25 more stop signs in which he had to install.

CLERK-TREASURER'S REPORT

Mrs. Epperly gave the financial report on the General Government and Water Works (Gross Revenue) Funds. She also stated that \$5,579.14 was to be collected for the taxes and \$1,983.00 to be collected for annual water bills.

POLICE REPORT

Chief Shirk gave the monthly police report consisting of 10 arrests, 13 complaints and \$200 in fines. He introduced the new full-time policeman to the council and stated that they had a part-time dispatcher.

Mr. Coleman asked the council about the selling of an international truck that belongs to the town. The council members agreed to sell the truck for \$100.

OFFICIAL SCHEDULE OF EMPLOYMENT

- PERSONNEL RECORDS

All employees for the Town of Surfside Beach shall become employed by the Council and/or Department Heads on instructions from Council.

Salaries for such employees shall be set by Council at time of employment. Salaries for Sanitation Department, Street and Waterworks Department other than Superintendent may be set by the Superintendent and approved by Council.

Employees completing six (6) months satisfactory service may receive 5% raise in pay. Additional 5% at the end of one (1) year. Any further raises as recommended by Department Head and approved by Council.

VACATIONS SHALL BE DETERMINED AS FOLLOWS:

After employed one year - 1 week vacation
After employed two years - 2 weeks vacation
After employed ten years - 3 weeks vacation
After employed twenty years - 4 weeks vacation

SICK TIME MAY BE DETERMINED AS FOLLOWS:

5 days if needed and upon proof of illness

In the event any Department Head need to be away from his job for more than ½ day for personal reasons that may arise from time to time shall inform the Mayor of such time.

Council must be informed at least thirty days in advance of the requested time each employee would like his vacation.

OFFICIAL HOLIDAYS SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:

New Years Day
Memorial Day
July 4th
Labor Day
Thanksgiving
Christmas (3 days)

In the event a Holiday shall fall on a regular non-working day, a day before or after shall be given.

In the case of Police Department employees where policemen are on duty Holidays, employees shall be given a day at another time as designated by the Police Chief. Such days shall not be cumulative.

The regular scheduled meeting of the Surfside Beach Town Council was held at 8:00 P.M. on May 4, 1971. The meeting was opened with invocation by Councilman Freeland.

Minutes of the previous council meeting were read. Mr. Sorensen stated that the title in which he gave the Clerk to be changed was an International Truck instead of a Ford in which was stated in the minutes. The Mayor asked the Clerk to change the minutes accordingly.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr Bryan suggested to the council to have a fishing rodeo contest from June 1 to Thanksgiving. It would consist of catching one of the 17 species of fish weighing more than indicated by the list in which Mr. Bryan had. The prizes would be \$15 for the month and \$2.50 for the day. At the end of the contest in Thanksgiving the first prize would be \$250, second prize \$150 and third prize \$100. Councilman Martin suggested that the business people of Surfside Beach contribute to this rodeo. The council members agreed that Mr. Bryan could go ahead and advertise this and the money would be contributed by the businessmen. This contest will also run for 10 days for the sun fun activities. Jim Daniels, the recreation director stated that the recreation dept. had received a certified franchise for the Dixie Youth baseball team.

WATER WORKS

Mr. Stroupe gave his monthly report of (14) building permits at \$696.00 and (6) water taps at \$660. He also stated that the water tank is going along as scheduled.

CLERK-TREASURER'S REPORT

Mrs. Epperly gave the monthly financial report on the General Government and Gross Revenue accounts. Mayor Smith stated that the first bond payment had been made on May 1 and that the audit report was good.

STREETS AND SANITATION

Mr. Felix indicated he had completed mowing on the North & South ends of town.¹ He asked the council for their approval to purchase a sign with caution on it. The council approved this. The Mayor asked Mr. Felix to get some extra help and fill in the holes in the streets with red clay. He also indicated that he had enough mosquito spray for two sprayings and would spray as soon as possible. The council asked Mr. Felix to purchase signs indicating tow in area or not parking on the passage ways to the beach. Mr. Coleman said everything was fine in the Sanitation department.

Admendment Section 15-3

Their pay and tenure in office shall be governed by section 2-97 amended of this code.

Admendment Section 2-97

Each department head-Clerk -Treasurer, Police Chief, Sanitation Supervisor, Water Supt., Street Supt., shall have the authority to hire employees. The department heads shall also have authority to terminate employees, who in their judgement are not performing their duties in a manner previously prescribed.

POLICE REPORT

Chief Shirk gave the monthly police report consisting of 9 investigations, 40 arrests, & \$1,084 in fines. He introduced the new dog catcher Dennis Ortlieb.

OLD BUSINESS

The business license were brought up concerning the rates on which the licenses are based. Mayor Smith ask Mr. Stroupe to go the Myrtle Beach & North Myrtle Beach Town halls and get a copy of thier business license to see if our rates should be changed accordingly. The council decided to have a meeting Wednesday afternoon May 12 to discuss this. The meeting was then adjourned.

JUNE 1, 1971

The regular scheduled meeting of the Surfside Beach Town Council was held at 8:00 P. M. on June 1, 1971. The meeting was opened with invocation by councilman Freeland. Minutes of the previous council meeting were read and approved by the council.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Griffin, Mr. Nettles, & Mr. Willoughby appeared before council to get relief from a drainage on 12th Ave. North and Cedar Drive. Mr. Felix stated that they needed to open a drain under the road to help prevent this problem. The Mayor ask that Mr. Felix and Mr. Stroupe estimate how much pipe would be needed to solve the problem on 12th Ave. They would then get in touch with Mr. Johnson to see if they could get some help from the highway department on this problem.

Chief Shirk requested that the council look into changing the vacation schedule. Mayor Smith stated that this would be discussed at the next council meeting. A motion was made by Councilman Sorensen to not have Town Hall open on Saturdays. Councilwoman Platt seconded the motion and all was favorable.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief Shirk gave his monthly report consisting of 43 arrests, 25 complaints, 2 accidents, and \$1,060 in police fines. He stated that the bronco has been approved and would be delivered soon.

WATER WORKS

Mr. Stroupe gave his monthly report on building permits and water taps for the month of May. He sold 5 building permits at \$279 and 3 water taps at \$378. He stated that Mr. Hugh Miley came and brought the plans on the new well and said that it would be started in July.

STREETS & SANITATION

Mr. Felix stated that he had mowed the South end and would soon complete the North end. Mr. Coleman stated that everything was doing just fine in the Sanitation Dept. Cleaning of the ditches was brought up and it was decided that this would be done in the fall due to the shortage of help.

JUNE 1, 1971



STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA)

WHEREAS, certain areas of the Town of Surfside Beach, County of Horry, State of South Carolina are subject to periodic flooding from the Atlantic Ocean causing serious damages to residential and other properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of Flood Insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 as amended; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this council to comply with land use and management criteria regulations as required in said act; and

WHEREAS, it is also the intent of this Council to recognize and duly evaluate flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

WHEREAS, Section 47 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1962 authorizes the Town of Surfside Beach to adopt land use and control measures such as are not inconsistent with said Code of Laws;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Council hereby assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it will take action as follows:

(1) Enact by December 31, 1971, and maintain in force for those areas, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in Subpart A of Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Regulations; and

(2) If necessary, seek State enabling legislation conferring authority to enact land use and control measures designed to reduce the exposure of property to flood loss; and

(3) Take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program. Such actions will include but not limited to:

(a) Assisting the Federal Insurance Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the flood plain having special flood hazard

(b) After flood insurance is made available, furnishing representatives of the National Flood Insurers Association (also appropriate Federal or State agencies, upon request) information concerning new or substantially improved structures within the area of special flood hazard. This information will include floor elevations and, if there is a basement, the distance between the first floor and the bottom of the lowest opening where water flowing on the ground will enter.

(c) Cooperating with Federal, State and local agencies which undertake to study, survey, map and identify flood-prone areas as well as cooperating with neighboring jurisdictions with respect to adjoining flood plains in order to prevent aggravation of the flooding problem.

(d) Providing the name of the individual and the office that will be responsible for furnishing the first floor elevation information.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Council hereby appoints the Surfside Beach-Building Inspector with the responsibility, authority and means to implement the commitment made herein.

In accordance with the provisions of the National Flood Insurance Act the Town of Surfside Beach, South Carolina hereby makes application for the Flood Insurance Program for its citizens.

In connection with said application enclosed herewith is a copy of a Resolution adopted by the Town of Surfside Beach, S. C., which includes a citation of the South Carolina Code authorizing land use and control measures by the Town of Surfside Beach.

At present there are no local flood plan management regulatory measures, although there are certain building codes, zoning easements and other measures that are not aimed primarily at the reduction of flood damage, but which would have some effect in that regard. The Building Codes are those known as the Southern Standard Building Codes as amended for our local use.

Also enclosed in duplicate is a map showing the approximate flood-prone areas adjacent to the Atlantic Ocean. The map very clearly indicates the corporate boundaries of the Town of Surfside Beach.

A clean map of Surfside Beach in black and white is also enclosed for your use.

It is estimated that a permanent population of 1,250 people, reside in the area shown on the map as being flood-prone. It is also estimated that there are 1,000 1 to 4 family residence properties located within that area and approximately 45 of small businesses there.

There has been some history of flooding in the Surfside Beach area, principally dating back to Hurricane Hazel of October 15, 1954 at which time there was considerably damage

to the entire community adjacent to the Atlantic Ocean resulting from that hurricane. Subsequent to that time there have been several brushes with hurricanes between 1954 and 1961. There have been no hurricane damages in the area since 1961, however, due to the path taken by many of the hurricanes which originate in the Caribbean or South Atlantic it would appear that there is a strong possibility of a further recurrence of hurricane damage in the area involved.

Following the approval of the Town of Surfside Beach area for Flood Insurance and the publication of flood hazard maps, such maps will be kept in the local City Hall located at Highway 17, Surfside Beach, S. C., where they will be available for public inspection.

It will be appreciated if you will examine the enclosures and advise the undersigned immediately, if anything further is needed in order to comply with the requirements for the Emergency Program of Federal Flood Insurance.



The regular scheduled meeting of the Surfside Beach Town Council was held at 8:00 P. M. on October 5, 1971. The meeting was opened with invocation by Mr. J. C. Anderson. Mayor Pro-Tem lead the meeting due to the Mayor's absence. Minutes of the previous council meeting were read and approved by Council.

NEW BUSINESS: It was discussed by the council that an ordinance be amended to avoid any future buildings being moved in and placed in Surfside. Councilman Martin stated that Mr. Austin Thompson had presented him with a sketch of a sign for the Town. Councilman Martin suggested that it might be a better idea to erect a "welcome" sign at the entrances of Surfside rather than putting the name on the water tank. It was agreed by all to have Mr. Thompson present his sketch and explain same at the next meeting. Councilwoman Platt suggested that some of the clubs may be willing to help with the expenses of the new signs.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mayor Pro-Tem Freeland read a letter from General Telephone Company in which they expressed much embarrassment for their previous letter in reference to their high rate on business licenses. They stated that in checking their records, they found they had made a mistake in the rates quoted in their previous letter and said that our rates were in line with everyone else.

Mr. Felix brought to the attention of the Council that a Public Hearing was held on June 2, 1970 in the Town Hall for the purpose of amending or changing the Zoning Ordinance to increase the minimum allowed square footage requirements in the Dogwood Lake Section and Dogwood Lake Extension Section. It was found that there was no record in the minutes nor an Ordinance pertaining to this matter. Mr. Felix stated that George Singleton had advised him of the new Ordinance passed in 1970 and that this had been violated. Mr. McCrackin stated that this change was voted on and approved but was not effective until it was put in the Ordinances. The Clerk was instructed to prepare the new Ordinance the following day to be effective as of this date.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Chief Wilhoit submitted a copy of the September report to the Council. There was a total of seven offenses totaling \$130.00, thirty five (35) complaints, and five (5) accidents. Chief Wilhoit advised the Council that he had ordered six "slow - children" signs to be placed in areas where there are ten or more children waiting for school buses. Two of these signs have already been erected and others will be as soon as they arrive.

WATER WORKS:

Mr. Felix asked that the Town purchase a new map to replace the old map used for the water works system as it has faded very badly and some places can not be read. It was agreed that this new map be purchased and the Clerk was instructed to contact Mr. Cox and make the necessary arrangements to purchase same.

Mr. Felix gave his monthly report consisting of ten (10) building permits totaling \$625.50 and eleven water taps totaling \$1,386.00.

Mr. Felix stated that due to the numerous complaints on the meter readings, he felt that there should be a service charge on the readings he had to re-check in hopes to cut down on these complaints. All council were against this as this is a service of the Town.

CLERK-TREASURER:

Clerk presented to the Council copies of the financial statements for the month of August. She also advised the Council of a request for an increase in salary for Sara Harrell, Assistant Clerk. Councilman Martin stated that this would have to wait until the new budget was prepared.





O R D I N A N C E

Of the Town of Surfside Beach, S. C.

BE IT ORDERED AND ORDAINED by the Town of Surfside Beach in Council Assembled and by the Authority Thereof that Section 5 - "R-1" District be amended so that when amended it shall read as follows:

That hereafter, October 5, 1971, all R-1 property in the Dogwood Lake Section and Dogwood Lake Extension Section shall be required to have the minimum square footage requirements as follows:

Fifteen (15) times the average of the sum of the rear and front property lines, but in no instance less than one thousand three hundred fifty (1,350) square feet, except for lots with an average sum of seventy (70) feet or less, in which case the minimum will be not less than one thousand (1,000) square feet.

Any two story residence must have a minimum of one thousand (1,000) square feet on the ground floor.

All square footage requirements set forth above shall be figured on the amount of the main body of the residence and shall exclude porches, garages, sun decks, patios, entry ways, or other projections.

The regular scheduled meeting of the Surfside Beach Town Council was held at 8:00 P. M. on November 2, 1971. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ocean View Memorial Hospital; Hospital Administrator, Mr. Turner and Directors Roy Govan and Elbert Jordan attended the meeting. They discussed the problems they were confronted with such as a great need for additional property, shortage of beds, etc. Mr. Govan stated that the Board of Directors did not know how to go about getting the revenue to help out the situation. They appealed to the council and Mayor for their thoughts and guidance as to what can be done to provide the health and welfare we need. Mayor Smith stated we would do anything we can to help and support them.

Welcome Signs; Mr. Austin Thomas with Art Kraft Signs presented sketches of proposed welcome signs to be erected at each entrance of Surfside along with a contract proposal. The contract price of each sign in accordance with sketch and specifications is for the sum of \$1,229.00. Mr. Thomas said that these signs must be placed within 100 feet of a business establishment. He also made a suggestion that one sign could be purchased now and one at a later date to help out financially. He also stated that this would have to be on a cash basis only. Mayor Smith stated that we would have to check out the financial status first and would let him know something next week.

Farm City Week; Mayor Smith stated that he had received a letter from the U. S. Department of Agriculture asking that November 19 - November 25 be declared Farm City Week and stated that he felt we should go along with this program.

OLD BUSINESS

George Wilson Construction Co.; Mayor Smith stated he had received a letter from George Wilson Construction Co. to notify us that all outstanding invoices of Carolina Utilities of Columbia, Inc. would be cleared upon the completion of their various projects, ours included. Completion of these projects are anticipated within the next twenty to thirty days and when their money is collected which should be within the next thirty to sixty days, all invoices will be processed and cleared.

Champion Map Corporation: Mayor Smith read a letter from Champion Corp. stating that we had purchased a champion map through ChamCo, which amounted to \$50.33 and had never received payment for same. It was billed out in 1969. No one remembered anything pertaining to this. Mayor Smith instructed Mrs. Rogers to write this company for more information and to find out what type of map was ordered.

New Water Well; Mayor Smith stated that something definite had to be decided on the new well because if they decide to go ahead with it, they must give the notice to proceed to Layne Atlantic. All were in agreement to go ahead with the new well.

Cable T. V.; Mr. Hamilton appeared before council and wanted to know if they were still bound by the agreement with Tabor Spry & Assoc. as they are also interested in coming to this area with his company. Mayor Smith stated he would check the agreement with Tabor Spry & Assoc. and if the agreement has been broken, he would notify Mr. Hamilton.

POLICE CHIEF:

Chief Wilhoit submitted copies of the October report to the council. There were a total of 13 offenses totaling \$420.00, recovery of 1 stolen car, 71 complaints, and one fatal accident. He stated he would have more information concerning the death after the investigation has been made. He reported there was a real safe Halloween and that traffic was well controlled. He advised that other "slow - children" signs would be put up tomorrow on Hollywood Drive. Mayor Smith asked Chief Wilhoit to instruct the police officers to hold down on the people they were allowing to ride around with as he was afraid there would be an accident.

APPOINTMENT OF PERMANENT POLICE CHIEF:

Mayor Smith stated that he was real proud of the good job Mr. Wilhoit is doing and was in favor of making Mr. Wilhoit the permanent Police Chief. Motion was made by Councilman Freeland and seconded by Councilman Sorensen. Everyone was in agreement.

RECORDER:

Councilman Freeland stated that we needed a Judge that could be here whenever needed as we are losing money due to the cases that have to be taken to Myrtle Beach or Conway. Councilman Martin was in agreement with this and stated that in no way was this a reflection on Jim Daniels.

WATER WORKS:

Mr. Felix gave his monthly report consisting of 17 building permits totaling \$614.80 and 9 water taps totaling \$1,134.00. Mr. Felix said that building permits had almost come to a complete stop for the month of October. He informed the council that the County and State has started opening up the ditches. Spraying for mosquitos was brought up but everyone agreed to hold off on this due to the rainy weather.

Mayor Smith stated that he had talked with Mr. Hugh Miley in connection with the sewage system survey and Mr. Miley told him that he could go ahead and work on the drainage system survey at the same time. Mayor Smith said he was in favor of this as we would have all of this information whenever it is decided to go ahead with the drainage system. Everyone was in favor. Mayor Smith informed the council that we could get 75% of the money to get the system in.


It was also decided that the building inspector use tags or a stamp to mark approved or rejected on each inspection made.






